"Building Strong Brains-Tennessee's ACEs Initiative"

This presentation is an evidence based study on how trauma, especially early childhood trauma, shapes brain development. Participants will learn how the young child's brain architecture is shaped by the interaction between genes and experiences which can have either a positive or negative result. Scientists have made it clear Adverse Childhood Experiences negatively impact the developing brain architecture of a young child and how children living in a safe, stable, nurturing environment of supportive families, caregivers, neighborhoods and communities will thrive.

"Human Trafficking"

Human Trafficking has become the second fastest growing criminal industry and it is affecting Tennessee! In the US, a child is a victim of human trafficking approximately every 2 minutes. Nearly 100 children are trafficked online each month in Tennessee. Knoxville has one of the state's highest reports of trafficking due to its proximity to three major interstate highways. These statistics reveal a disturbing problem about our community.
